In addition to serving as a training site for behavioral health interns, the organization launched a rural family medicine residency program earlier this year. These resident doctors will train at Aviva Health for three years, culminating in Board certification as family medicine physicians.

Additionally, through a partnership with Southwest Oregon Area Health Education Center, Aviva Health is part of the ReConnect Gap-year Fellowship Program, offering pre-health college undergraduates employment as medical scribes in a clinical setting while simultaneously preparing them for advanced medical degree programs.

The organization is also a clinical training site for OHSU and UCC students pursuing a variety of health care careers.
